Dear all.

I regret to bring you the sad news that my Father, John White of Plantation. FI has passed at the age of 86. My Father was one of the pioneers of the Antique Automobile collector and restorers hobby and helped organize many clubs and early events in the Jacksonville region. Our family moved to South Florida in 1976 when my father was transferred by his employer Sherwin Williams, but for many years he traveled back to Jacksonville to attend local shows and events because Jacksonville and all the people there were always "home". Though I left Jax at ten years old, I have so many memories embedded from those good times that I can still hear and see them; the root-beer floats O.C. Davis would make, the Oyster Roast at Carl Bowles', getting to ride on Noel Dana's Auto Redbug in his back yard (every kids dream car), Buddy Osborne showing me how he used to "spit nails" at the upholstery when he worked at the Ford assembly plant, and so many more people like Don Boas, Ray Huppee, Richard Bendetti, the Cowarts, if you wanted to erect an old Gas Station or Drive In Restaurant Bill Dees had enough at his flea market spots, and so many more things and people I will always remember.

REMINISCE BY RANDY WHITE.(NO RELATION TO JOHN) RANDY LIVED A BLOCK FROM JOHN...

Here's an old car story, involving your dad Up until about 1954, my mom owned and drove a '37 Ford convertible, that was nicknamed "Jezibel", and that your dad, who then was likely in his early 20's, adored. It was a sharp car, painted forest green with white pinstripes. Several times he told my mom that if she ever wanted to sell it to please let him know. Well, she didn't listen and after the passenger side door of that car came open one day, as she rounded a corner in the neighborhood and I flew out, getting some 'asphalt rash' and landing on my butt. She went down to Burwell Chevrolet in Jax. the very next day and traded Jezebel in on a brand new '54 Chevy Belair. When your dad learned she'd traded Jezebel, he ran down to the dealership, but Jezebel was longgone.

But, I still hold many fond memories or him taking us kids on rides in his Model T touring car, his Model A's and scaring hell out of us when we rode with him on that old Cushman. He could lean that thing over so far that the floorboard would scrape on the pavement, sending a shower of sparks flying everywhere.
