Greetings from Alaska, "the last frontier". May is in the rearview mirror, and we're looking at June through the wind screen. June 1st is the official start of the Atlantic hurricane season and, in addition to Father's Day (June 19th), Flag Day (June 14th), there are many more celebratory events throughout the month that you may not even know about. From fun, food-centric national days (like National Egg Roll Day- June 10th and National Strawberry Rhubarb Pie Day-June 9th) to serious days of remembrance (like D-Day-June 6th and National Cancer Survivors Day-June 5th), June's holidays and observances include important dates and shareable occasions for everyone.

Before summer 2022 officially begins on June 21st, the last days of spring include a wide range of holidays, including the Jewish holiday of Shavuot (start June 4th & ends June 6th), the Christian holiday of Pentecost (June 5th), and the British Sovereign Ceremony of Trooping the Colour (June 2nd), among others. Let's take a look at the club's finances as we motor into June. First our cash flow shows income of \$72.00 comprised of the proceeds from the 50/50 raffle at the May meeting of \$23.50 and the other portion won by Cindy Breslin who donated that amount back to the club and that's reflect in the donations collected of \$38.50. We also received \$10.00 in 2022 half year dues from new member Scott Peterson and his wife Debra. A warm welcome to Scott and Debra. Expenses this month totaled \$200.00 which was donations of \$100.00 each to Rodeheaver Boy's Ranch and the Florida Youth Challenge Academy. As a result, we have \$3,918.11 in available funds as of June 1st.

A review of our Budget versus Actuals shows our income tracking slightly behind in donations given that we are approaching the mid-point of our fiscal year. Membership income also appears to be lagging, but this is an area that we see activity at the end of the fiscal year into the beginning of the new year. Even with that said, we will most likely miss our budgeted amount this year since we lost eight members this year. At this point, I anticipate that we will have a negative variance at the end of the year of approximately \$300.00.

Last month at the May meeting, a donation of \$100.00 to Rodeheaver Boys Ranch was authorized and Ken sent a check to them. For your information, attached is a copy of the letter that I received in the mail yesterday acknowledging our donation.
