WOODYISMS

July is in the rearview mirror and we're looking at August through the windshield. August is kind of seen as the last hurrah of warm weather. It's widely considered the end of summer, as families squeeze in last-minute vacations and beach trips before their kiddos prepare to go back to the classroom for a new school year and for us vintage car owners without air conditioning, we can look forward to cooler weather approaching so we can get out and drive without enduring the stifling hot temperatures. There are no major federal holidays celebrated during the month of August, but we can look forward to seeing two full moons.

Yes, during August 2023, two full moons will occur. The first full moon in August, called the Sturgeon Moon, will rise on Aug. 1, according to the Farmer's Almanac. This moon got its name from the prehistoric-looking sturgeon fish which seem to be more easily caught at this time. They are found primarily in the Great Lakes and Lake Champlain.

The August second full moon of —a **Blue Moon (defined as the second full moon in a calendar month)**—will happen on Aug. 30, 2023. Plus both of these will be supermoons; this kind of full moon is when the moon is closest to earth, making it appear much bigger in the sky than usual. After these two supermoons, the last supermoon of 2023 will be in September.

Prepare for your moon gazing, but first let's take a look at our cash flow summary for August. Our income this month was derived from the July 50/50 raffle, the club's share of \$32.00 and the raffle winner, Dan Lyman who donated his share to the club. We have one outstanding expense, the cost of Lunch for our guests, the Warner's, at the July meeting. I don't have an amount yet but will record that in the August Cash flow summary when I receive the information. As a result, as of 1 August we have \$4,413.72 in available funds.

Our "Budget vs Actuals" report for the month indicates that we are tracking well in both income and expenses to this point in the year. The only area where I see a dip will be in dues income as we close out the year since we have lost several members this year. This can only be corrected if we recruit new members for the club
